They are responsible for hiring teachers, planning the school curriculum, and preparing the school budget, which this year totals $\$ 1,000,000$. In East Cleveland the cost per pupil averages $\$ 332$ yearly, ranging from $\$ 166$ per kindergarten pupil to $\$ 350$ for each senior high school student. East Cleveland can be extremely proud of its Board of Education for maintaining democratic ideals and high scholastic standards in East Cleveland schools.
