Shaw opened her 1964 football campaign by scoring a 32-14 victory over the West High "Cowboys" at Shaw Stadium. The TD's were due mainly to aerials tossed by Pat Visci of 17 yards, 14 yards, and 35 yards. Pat ran 10 yards for the other touchdown. The Cardinals cleared the bench during the last quarter.

The 1964 Shaw Football team concluded the season with a 7-2-1 record, thereby sharing the L.E.L. championship with Valley Forge. This is the fourth year in a row that the mighty Shaw Cardinals, under the supervision of head coach Don Drebus, have either won or shared the championship. Shaw led her opponents in scoring with a total of 210 points to the opponents 102. In total yardage they led 2604 to 1956.

On the following Friday evening, Shaw dropped a squeaker to a young BereaMidpark team with a final score of 18-14. The lead changed hands five different times, but the Cardinals could not come up with the big play in the final minutes of the game.

This frustrating defeat was followed by an exciting win over the long time rival, Collinwood, with a score of $38-6$. The usual overflow crowd of some 8,000 fans watched as the Birds recorded their 20th win in the series. Shaw rolled up 382 yards against Collinwoods 174. Three of the six TD's were made by fullback, Joe Jenkins. The Cardinals gained the lead in the first play of the second period and regained it without letting Collinwood score until the final moments of the game when the Railroaders scored 6 points on a TD.

Carter took the ball to the 5 where Carter crashed across for the score. Visci swept his own right end for the extra points as the Birds led 16-6. The score stayed at this point until the end of the game.

The Cardinals suffered a severe blow in their attempt for a fourth straight Lake Erie League title in the Shaker contest. Early in the second quarter, Shaker scored. The extra point attempt was blocked and they led 6-0. Shaw retaliated when Pat Visci threw a screen pass to end Madison Nimmons who ran 63 yards to make the score 6-6. Early in the third period, Mel Carter blasted his way into the end zone to give Shaw a 12-6 lead. The conversion run was a perfectly executed reverse in which Pete Wolfgram crossed into the end zone with no opposition. The play was called dead, however, on the opposite side of the field by an official who thought the faking halfback had the ball. Later in the period, Shaker equalized the score 12-12. In the fourth quarter, the Shaw defense stopped a Shaker attempt on the one yard line.

The team successfully opened their Lake Erie League season by defeating a hopeful Cleveland Heights team 8-6 in an exciting game showing plenty of action. Early in the second quarter, Cardinal Mel Carter crashed his way into the end zone to make the score 6-0. Visci then fired to Madison Nimmons for the conversion aerial and Shaw went ahead 8-0. With five minutes remaining in the game, the Tigers scored but the extra points were checked by the Shaw defensive line.

While 3700 football fans sat through a drizzling, freezing rain, Shaw painted a $16-6$ victory over the Brush Arcs. The first half ended in a scoreless deadlock. The third quarter found both teams exchanging punts as the continuous rain poured down hampering any movement. Later in the third period the Arcs scored from the one-yard line. The extra point attempt failed as linebacker Robin Caputo stopped the Brush quarterback short of the goal. Visci fired to Wolfgram for the conversion as the Cardinals took a $16-0$ halftime lead. With two minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, Euclid Q.B. Subel fired to end Everstine to put the Panthers on the score board. The two points were made ending the scoring and the game.

The gridders from SHS suffered their first league loss at Valley Forge. The Patriots scored the winning TD with seven seconds left to play. In the second quarter, Visci was forced to punt from deep in his own end zone. Forge returned it to the 23 yard line and drove to the three. They crashed into the end zone for the score but the extra point pass was checked. Shaw returned the second half kick-off to their own 30 yard line and began a sustained scoring drive which ate up 70 yards and 9 minutes of the third period. Visci's passes, and runs by Jenkins and Mel Carter, moved the ball to the seven, where Visci swept his own right end for the equalizer. A conversion pass was short, putting the score at 6-6. The action in the fourth quarter was highlighted by the Valley Forge TD in the last 7 seconds to end the game.
