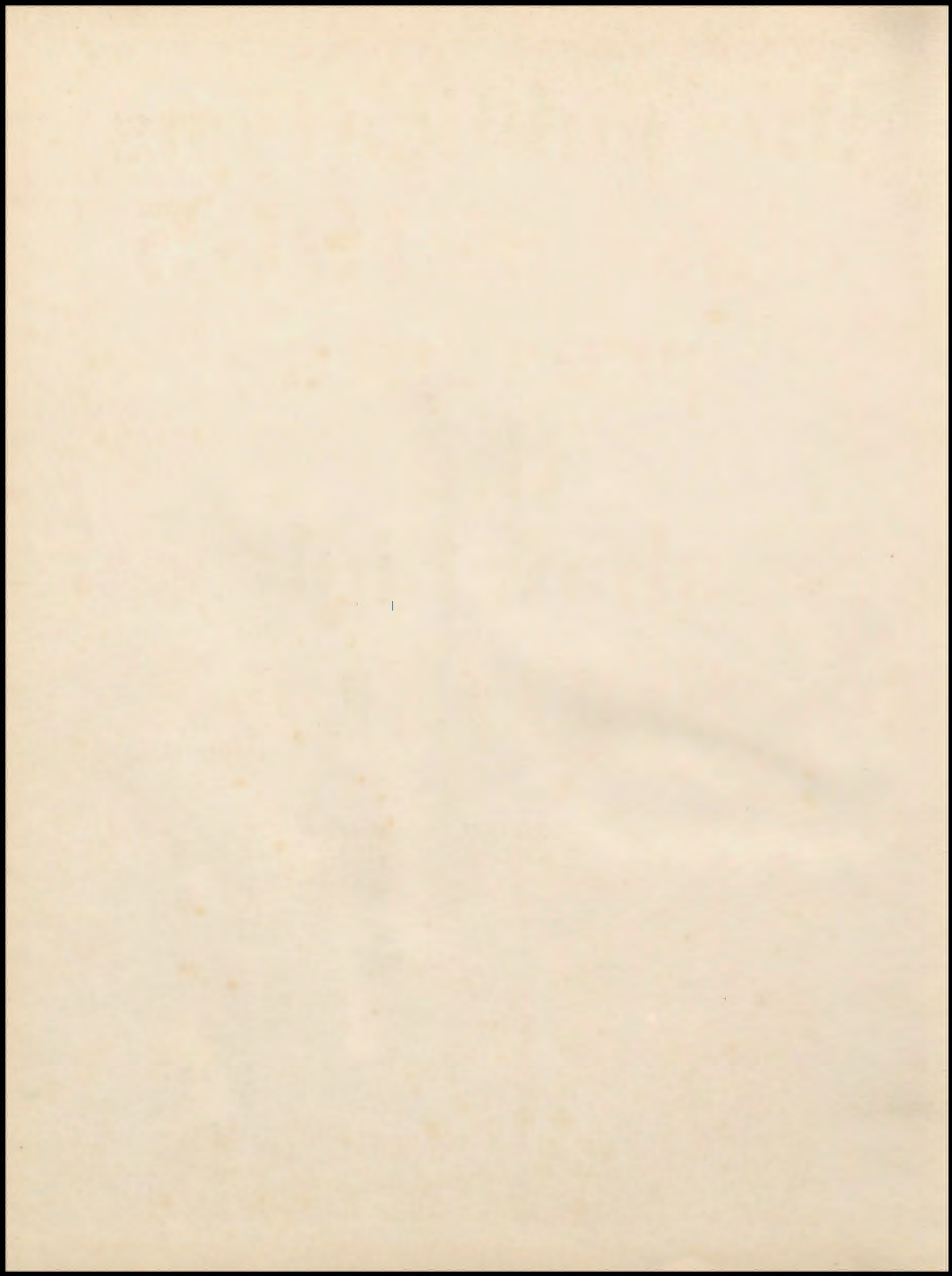

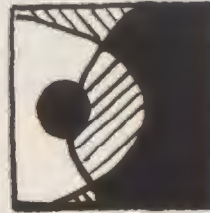

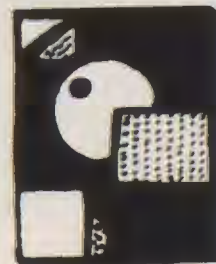

"YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU" 1965

Meredith Wilson's musical comedy "Music Man" was a smash hit as Shaw High School's 1964 Black and Red Revue. With moods ranging from gay, rollicking humor to a tender love story this production was appealing to all.

Set in the heart of the Midwest, River City, Iowa, in the early nineteen hundreds this is the tale of a con man who peddled musical instruments and band uniforms to unwary towns-people. Having had no musical background, Harold Hill skipped town as soon as he secured the money with his promises for organizing a town band left unfulfilled. However it became apparent he was no match for the residents of River City, especially Marian, the librarian.

With the lead roles performed by Bill Howell and Sally Parsh this production proved to be a truly delightful evening of entertainment.

"You Can't Take It With You" was the fall production for 1964. This was the story of a slightly eccentric family and the problems that had to be dealt with by two young people in love. Alice Vanderhoff, played by Sue Vogler, was the only "normal" person in the topsy-turvy Vanderhoff household. Ted Malan, Shaw's American Field Service student from South Africa, took the part of Tony Kirby, the son of two extremely conventional people. Other major roles were performed by Tom Liptak, Kathy Wassil, Chris Martin, Stan Dickinson, Karen Eller and Leah Turnbull.

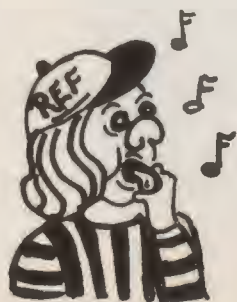
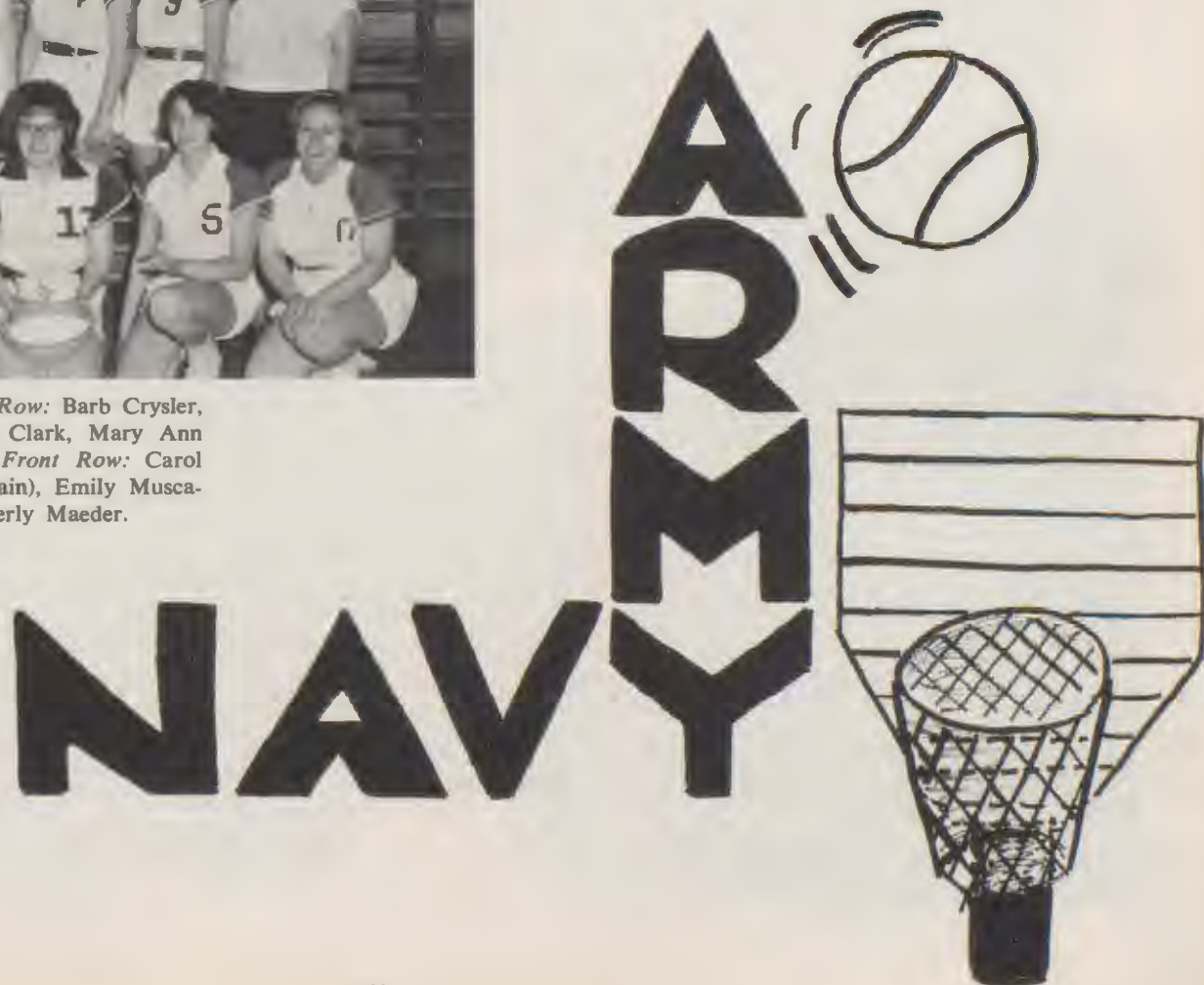

Shaw opened her 1964 football campaign by scoring a 32-14 victory over the West High "Cowboys" at Shaw Stadium. The TD's were due mainly to aeriels tossed by Pat Visci of 17 yards, 14 yards, and 35 yards. Pat ran 10 yards for the other touchdown. The Cardinals cleared the bench during the last quarter.

The 1964 Shaw Football team concluded the season with a 7-2-1 record, thereby sharing the L.E.L. championship with Valley Forge. This is the fourth year in a row that the mighty Shaw Cardinals, under the supervision of head coach Don Drebus, have either won or shared the championship. Shaw led her opponents in scoring with a total of 210 points to the opponents 102. In total yardage they led 2604 to 1956.

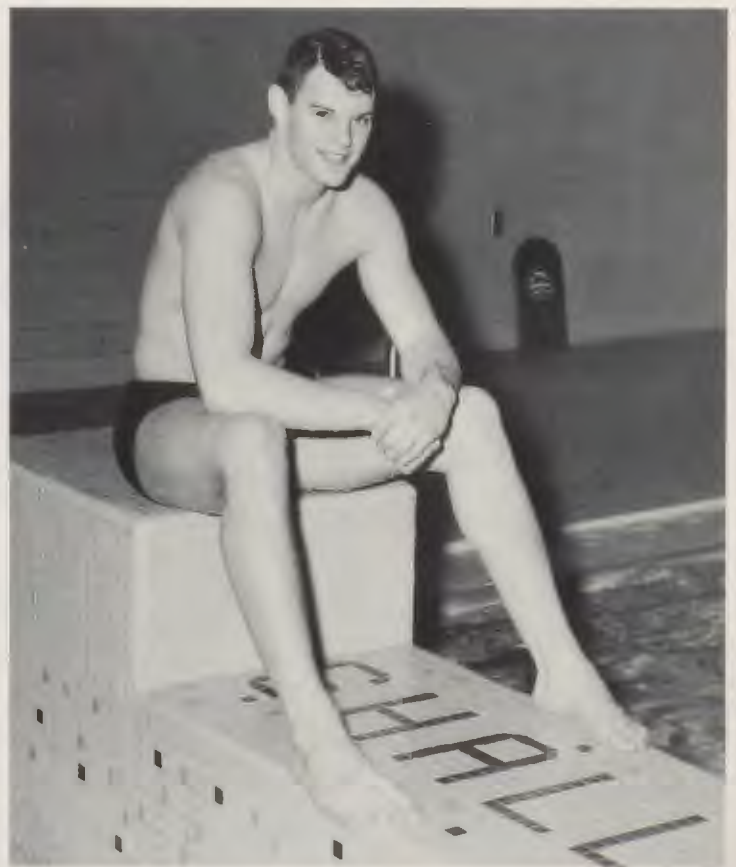
