Q&A with Ms. Karen Murray

What is your career or profession? I am an Adult Reference Associate. I provide information and resources to the community. I started out as a Children's Associate in outreach, and have been with ECPL for 14 years.

What types of materials do you checkout?

Mostly self-help and motivational books.

Tell me about the upcoming U.S. Census. One of my additional duties involves special projects. The U.S. Census is a count of every living person in the United States, and it guides how resources are distributed. It is taken every ten years, and the next one will be conducted March – April 2020. East Cleveland Public Library is working with other county libraries to inform the public about the importance of the Census. I attend community meetings and provide information. Currently, the government needs thousands of workers – I like to call them foot soldiers – to count every resident. Packets will be mailed to all residents, and they have the option of mailing in their form, or completing the questionnaire online. We will assist patrons with completing the form online in our Career Center [within ECPL's Computer Lab, 2nd floor].

The Coretta Scott King Award is an annual award presented by the Ethnic & Multicultural Information Exchange Round Table, part of the American Library Association (ALA). Named for Coretta Scott King, wife of Martin Luther King, Jr., this award recognizes outstanding books for young adults and children by African Americans that reflect the African-American experience. Awards are given both to authors and to illustrators.

The Coretta Scott King award titles represent a wide variety of literary genres at varying reading and interest levels. They not only deserve to be considered by teachers for student projects, but should also be incorporated into the curriculum as a teaching tool.

The idea for the Coretta Scott King Award originated at a meeting of the American Library Association in Atlantic City in 1969. Black librarians at the meeting lamented the lack of recognition for minority writers. No person of color had won either the Newbery or Caldecott Medals at that time. Before the conference ended, a group of African American librarians had formed to promote the creation of a new award. The award's name was intentionally chosen to honor recently assassinated Martin Luther King Jr., and his wife, Coretta Scott King. The name also commemorates the life of Dr. King and honors the dedication Coretta Scott King had to making the world a place that welcomes all people.

East Cleveland Public Library's Children's staff has created a beautiful display depicting the life of Coretta Scott King as well as a selection of Coretta Scott King award winning books available for check-out. This display will be a permanent part of the Children's Department. The expectation is that school children in East Cleveland will read and discuss the books.

Please come see this display and discover the marvelous books that have been recognized as reflecting the African-American experience.


